Having taken into consideration your recent feedback—and also reflected on our own reactions to last week's game—we (Dr. Oelze and the TAs) have decided to make the following minor changes to Time-Machine Millionaire.


Changes will be phased in: encouraged today and required beginning next week.

Timing and Focus:

- 1. There will now be a Powerpoint that helps keep us on track and within our time limits. The Powerpoint clarifies the 4 rounds of the game:
 - Round 1: Understand and Remember
 - Round 2: Analyze (Compare the past and the past situations and time periods).
 - Round 3: Evaluate (Ask the Audience)
 - Round 4: Synthesis (Come up with a creative solution to the issue at hand).
- 2. If I feel that the conversation has strayed too far off topic or that an individual is hogging the mic, I will sound my buzzer. That it has signal to move on to the next segment or to pass the mic.

Ask the Audience:

3. In order to make space for creative reflection, we will pause the game right before Round 3. Everyone in the audience will have 2 minutes to focus on writing relevant questions for the contestants. These should be sent via SLACK specifically in the #scholarlyquestions chatroom. If you do not currently have access to the #scholarlyquestions chat, do the following: computer users can click on the + sign next to the word "Channels", but iphone and Android users need to actually click on the very word "Channels" itself. Click the word. That should give you the chance to add the #scholarlyquestions as a new chatroom.



4. The TAs and I will pick the most relevant and challenging questions. These will be asked to the contestants. The authors of those questions will receive Slack points towards their final grade.

High Expectations and Staying in Character

5. In order to maintain high expectations and help contestants stay in character, each student will be allowed to bring no more than one notecard up on the stage with them. The rest of the information about their character should be considered and researched before the day of the gameshow.
